Biographical Information Overview of Interview: Bill Lair, a long-time friend of Jim and Brenda Edgar, was born on August 14, 1948 in Peoria, Illinois, and grew up in Ottawa, Illinois. Following graduation from Eastern Illinois University, where he knew of Jim Edgar only as the President of the student body, Lair pursued journalism as a profession and eventually landed a job as a sports reporter for the Mattoon *Journal-Gazette* & Charleston *Times-Courier*. He and his wife also attended the same Methodist church that Jim and Brenda Edgar attended in Charleston, where they got to know each other. Bill's wife Marty supported Jim Edgar's failed 1974 campaign for state legislator, and from that time forward, both Lairs followed Edgar's political career closely. Edgar, for his part, made a point of keeping close connection with Charleston and Coles County.

Lair speaks about the pride that most Coles County citizens have for Edgar's career, and shared some memorable experiences he had enjoyed with Edgar over the last thirty-some years.
